MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

On behalf of the members of the Mokelumne Rural Fire Protection District, I am proud to present our 2025 Annual Report. This report reflects the hard work, professionalism, and dedication of our firefighters, staff, Board of Directors, and community partners who serve our district every day.

The Mokelumne Fire District continues to experience increasing demand for emergency and public safety services. As call volume grows and incidents become more complex, our commitment to protecting life, property, and the environment remains stronger than ever. Whether responding to medical emergencies, structure fires, vehicle accidents, vegetation fires, hazardous materials incidents, water rescues, or technical rescue emergencies, our personnel stand ready 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

One of our most significant accomplishments in 2025 was the continued success of our Seasonal Firefighter Program. By adding one seasonal firefighter to each shift for nine months of the year, we enhanced our operational readiness and expanded our response capabilities. Combined with our full-time staffing, this program allows us to place two fully staffed fire engines in service during peak fire season, improving response times, firefighter safety, and service to our community when demand is at its highest.

We also made important investments in the future of the district through grant funding and organizational improvements. During the year, we secured funding to replace our aging water tender, ensuring reliable apparatus for years to come. We were also awarded a Cybersecurity Grant that will strengthen our technology infrastructure by replacing computers, enhancing critical incident command capabilities, and improving dispatch and emergency communications. These investments will help ensure our personnel have the tools and technology necessary to safely and effectively serve the public.

Internally, we continued to strengthen the organization by reviewing and updating departmental policies and procedures, improving operational consistency, accountability, and compliance with current fire service best practices. We remained committed to providing high-quality training, maintaining specialized rescue capabilities, and strengthening our partnerships with neighboring agencies through mutual aid, automatic aid, and regional response programs.

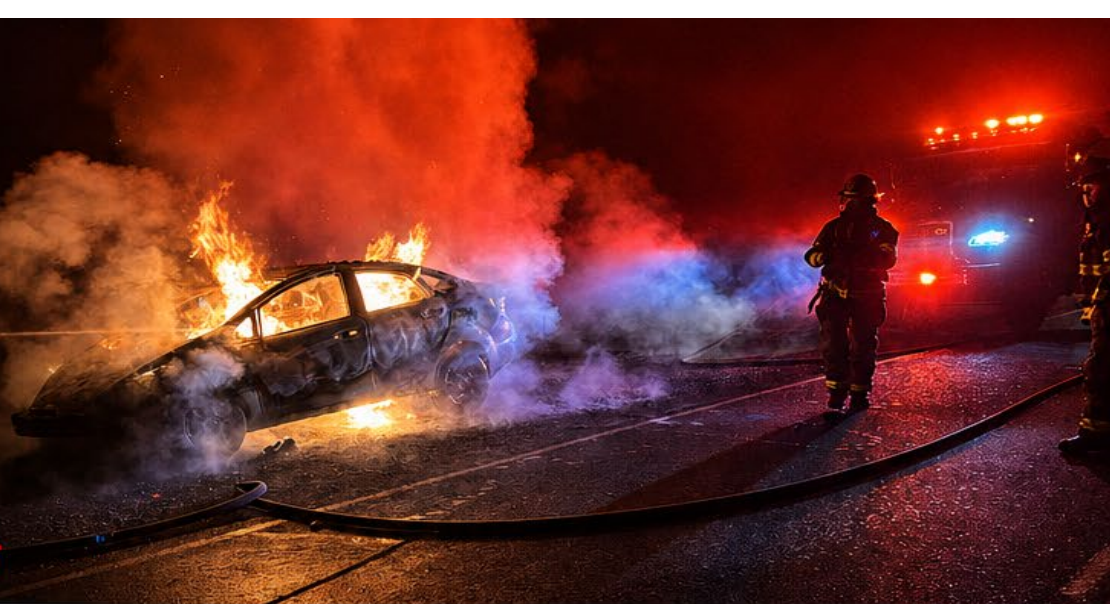

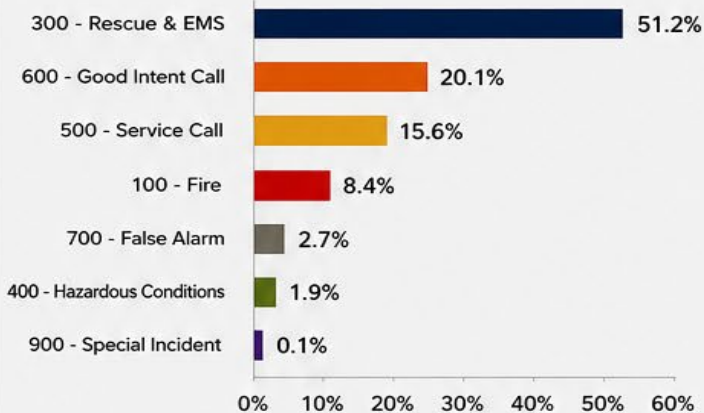

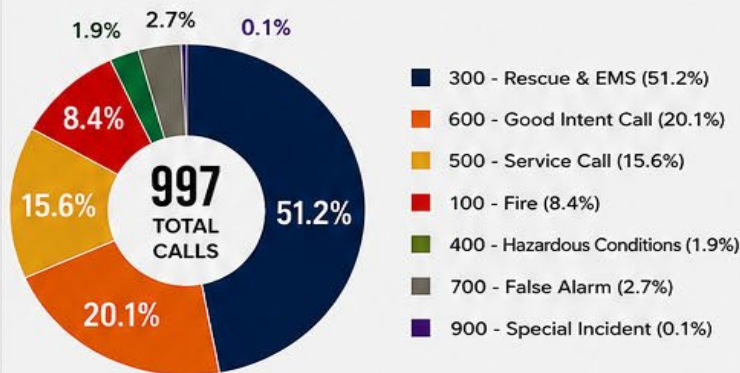

The District was established as an independent California Special District on February 18, 1947, with local governance and taxation authority to support fire protection and emergency services throughout the community.

The District is governed by a five-member elected Board of Directors. Board members serve as policymakers, financial stewards, and operational overseers who ensure the District operates effectively, efficiently, and in alignment with its mission and community needs.

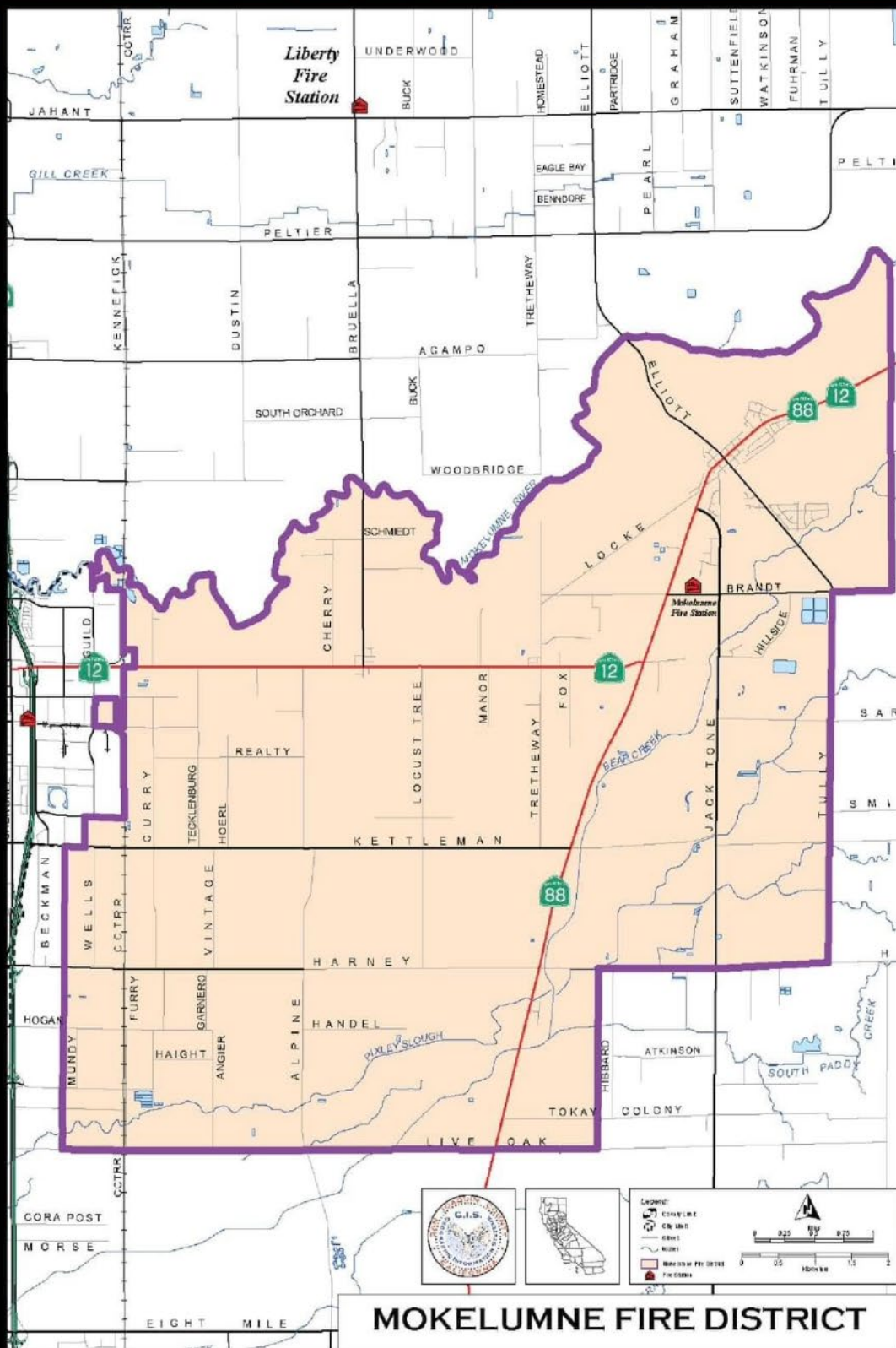
OUR MISSION
